- Our Old Testament lessons continue in the book of Numbers. The Lord led the Israelites to do battle with the heathen tribes who lived in Canaan.
- In history we are learning about the many civil rights movements of the 1960's and 70's: African, Mexican, Native, and Asian Americans, as well as the Women's Movement.
- In our English textbooks the students are learning about the many irregular verbs in our language, the agreement of subjects and verbs, and how to use the dash.
