## Mr. Falk: Grades 7-8

- The Old Testament studies in Exodus tell the students about the Israelites receiving manna, quail, and water from God in the wilderness. The Lord then led them to Mt. Sinai where He gave them the ten commandments.
- English grammar lessons are teaching the students about dependent and independent clauses as well as reflexive and intensive personal pronouns.
- Our history topics are about America's response to World War II in Europe. After attempts to remain neutral, Japan attacked Pearl Harbor and the U.S. declared war.
- In the various math classes we are studying symbols of inclusion, circumference and pi, similar triangles with corresponding parts, and unit multipliers.
