Mr. Falk: Grades 7-8

- The Old Testament readings in Numbers have been telling the students about the frequent complaints of the Israelites, especially after the 12 spies scouted the promised land of Canaan with its strongly fortified cities.
- Our math topics have been showing the students how to find a percent of a number, graphing inequalities, and solving products of square roots.
