Classroom News

Mrs. Kuehl: 4K

- We do not have Show and Tell this week as we do not have school on Friday.
- In our Bible lessons this week we have added two lessons not normally covered in our 48 lessons. We learned how Jesus told His disciples about His second coming and what it will mean for us as believers. We also learned of the special supper Jesus celebrated with His disciples on the night that He was captured by His enemies. We saw what happened in the Garden of Gethsemane as Jesus prayed for strength to bear what this night and following day held in store for Him.
- Thanks for continuing to send outdoor winter gear!
 We will normally try to go out for a bit each day, unless the wind chill temperature is too cold.
- We will be singing "Let Me Learn of Jesus" for the Lenten service on Wed., March 13th. A copy of the words came home last week for practice and review. Please sing or read through the song just once each night before bed to keep it fresh in our minds and hearts! A light supper is always served before these Lenten services, so check the posters by the doors for more details if you are interested in joining us!

- We do not have Show and Tell this week as we do not have school on Friday.
