Classroom News

Mrs. Kuehl: 4K

- For Show and Tell on Friday, please bring something that has an interesting texture for us to experience!.
- We have begun to learn several Bible passages to go along with our Bible Lessons. These memory treasures will be reviewed throughout the year to keep them in our hearts as a reminder of God's great love for us as we go through life! This week we are learning how and why God saved Noah and his family from the flood waters and we are reminded of how God also saves us through water combined with God's Word in Baptism!
- These first few weeks we are spending time getting into the routines of going to school, making new friends, and working together!
- We have been working on learning the uppercase letters found in our names. We are matching cutout letters to name boards to learn the proper order, building letters with sticks and curves, and also with playdough "worms". We have just started our trip through the alphabet to take a closer look at how other letters are formed and the basic sound that each one has. Watch for items to come home in folders to review letter basics.

Mrs. Kuehl: Kindergarten

- So far this year in our Bible study, we have learned about God's wonderful creation of our world, and how His perfect world was forever changed by sin. We will be giving special emphasis to the lowercase letters. We have also started working with some simple books to add to our reading bag here at school. We enjoy sharing them with our parents, daily helpers, and sometimes even with other friends!

- We are studying living and nonliving things in science.
- We are finishing our social studies unit on maps.
- We are finishing our first math unit on numbers and place value.

Mrs. Lahmann: Grades 5-6

- Christlight/Catechism: We are studying Cain & Abel, and the Flood. The First Commandment- how we are to fear, love, and trust in God above all things.
